## Sulfonylurea insulin secretagogues

Type of drug	Sulfonylurea insulin secretagogues
How does it work?	Helps the pancreas to make more insulin
Typical names	Glicazide (Diamicron®), Glimepiride (Amaryl®), Glyburide (DiaBeta®)
Usual doses	<ul> <li>Glicazide 80 - 320 mg in single or divided doses</li> <li>Gliclazide MR 30 - 120 mg once daily</li> <li>Glimepiride 1 to 8 mg once daily</li> <li>Glyburide 2.5 to 20 mg in single or divided doses</li> </ul>
Dosing instructions	<ul> <li>Take Glyburide / Gliclazide at or before meals at the same time each day</li> <li>Take Gliclazide MR / Glimepiride with breakfast or first main meal of the day</li> </ul>
What if I forget a dose?	Ask your healthcare provider

Effect on weight	†
Risk of low blood sugar (hypoglycemia)	Yes
Medication considerations and/or side effects	May cause low blood sugar (especially if irregular meals and/or medications is taken at irregular times)
When to call your doctor	<ul> <li>You have many low blood sugar reactions or have trouble dealing with them contact your health care provider</li> <li>You develop any severe side effects and any negative changes in your overall health talk to your health care provider</li> </ul>
When you are sick	<ul> <li>You are sick, vomiting, have diarrhea, or cannot drink enough fluids, you should stop this medication until these symptoms go away</li> <li>Check your blood sugar levels more often, and drink lots of fluids so you do not become dehydrated</li> </ul>
